1. **Roll Call**

2. **Approval of the December 7, 2016 Minutes**

Motion by Hall, seconded by Smith, to approve the December 7, 2016 minutes and place them on file.

Ayes all; Nays none; Motion carried.

3. **Survey questions for Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan**

Director Schrader asked the Commissioners for one last review of the survey questions for the Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan. He made the changes recommended two months ago.

Commissioner McDonald stated that she didn't see specific questions about the Green Trail and Riverfront Rendezvous. The City is a big part of the Green Circle Trail and feels the City should get credit for it. Also wonders if we could ask if the people filling out the questionnaire have contributed to the Green Circle either financially or by doing some work on the trail. Riverfront Rendezvous is a big event for the City and she feels the Parks Department is should be recognized for the work done each year. Funding for both of these is important.

Commissioner Sorenson agreed that it is important to connect the Parks Department to Riverfront Rendezvous. Commissioner McDonald feels we should be marketing events sponsored by the Parks Department in order to associate events with the Parks Department. We need to know how residents value the Riverfront Rendezvous.

The Green Circle is mentioned in the survey but the commissioners agreed that there should be a separate question for Riverfront Rendezvous. Director Schrader will add a question specific to Riverfront Rendezvous to the survey as a stand-alone question.

Motion by Glodosky, seconded by Sorenson to approve and send the survey questions on to the consultants.

4. **Review 2016 Annual Usage Report**

Director Schrader referred to the 2016 Usage Report in the Board packet hi-lighting a few informational facts from each category.

From the General Park usage/events the parks department had 249 lodge rentals, 33 Meeting Room rentals and 110 gym rentals with an average of 75 people at the lodge rentals would equal about 19,000 people in the park lodges over the May through October rentals.

We sold over \$7000.00 dollars' worth of tickets to Wisconsin Dells Amusement Parks and to the Milwaukee Zoo.

The Parks Department assists with set-up for events downtown such as Discover Downtown, Corn on the Curb and the Christmas Parade.

The Piffner Pioneer Park Band shell hosts the City Band concerts, Movies in the Park, Taste of the Town, Jazz Fess, Art in the Park and the private rental for Gus Macker. These events with Riverfront Rendezvous generate about 100,000 guests at Piffner Park during the summer season.

The Community Media Recorded, Edited, Cablecast (TV), and Webcast approximately:

- **100 meetings (approximately - usually 7-8 per month)**
- 15 episodes of "Portage County Matters"
- 11 episodes of "Talking Point with Mayor Wiza"

Also Videotaped, edited, cablecast (TV), and uploaded to YouTube & Social Media:

- Fourth of July Parade, Riverfront Rendezvous Fireworks, Christmas Parade, Candidates Forums, other special events.
- City Employee Training Sessions (Law, etc.)
- Many short, topical segments from "Talking point" and "Portage County Matters."
- Special short "Greeting Card" videos at every holiday. People like those. They help us gain followers.

Began Using Adobe Premiere instead of Final Cut Pro for Editing

- Allows for a much more streamlined work process and gets programs on the air faster.
- Stopped archiving programs on DVDs, saving time, space, and some costs.

TV Programs Produced/Submitted by the Public:

- **500+ episodes (not including re-runs in this time period) of regularly-scheduled Public shows.**
- 70 new events advertised on the TV Community Calendar.

Made several thousand changes to the Website, including:

- 300+ Changes made to Pages
- **350+ Agendas & Minutes Added**
- **230+ Calendar Events Published (375 Meetings, Pool Events, 130 Public Events, Concerts, etc.)**
- **787 New Documents & changes made to Docs. (Ordinances, Applications, Forms, etc.)**
- 26 Job Postings Made
- 464 News Flashes Published

Developed and Published a Mobile App

- It was so popular it was featured on all local Newspapers & Wausau TV news programs.

Social Media

- **Facebook Page Followers increased 34%.**
- **Made 900 Facebook Posts. Reach was 667,883.** (Times people who were served activity from our Page including our posts, mentions, Ads, and check ins.) Over **53,000 Engagements** (Post Clicks, Reactions, Comments, and Shares).

LPFM Radio

- **Went on the air August 14, 2015**
- Have had NO technical problems, outages, interference issues, or complaints

- Have had a LOT of positive verbal feedback from residents who listen
- Have been **playing Polka** (since Jan.) and Folk (since Aug.) Shows on **Sundays**
- Successful participation in Federal Emergency Broadcast tests
- Announced Snow Emergencies in March and December
- Played many Public Safety PSAs, locally and nationally produced
- Before Christmas, started playing music off our own server, which gets us one step closer to Streaming capability.
- **Purchased, cataloged, and tagged a library of over 10,000 songs from 1950s to 2000s.**

Forestry Department

Grants and Awards

- **Applied for and received \$2,500 from Wisconsin Public Service for tree planting.**
- **Aldo Leopold Audubon Society donated \$1,000 for Iverson Park tree planting.**
- Applied for and received Stevens Point's 35th Tree City designation.

Tree, shrub, flower planting

- **269 trees planted on public property.**
- Tree planting occurs in spring and fall.
- Downtown Shopko parking lot re-landscaped.
- **A new rain garden was installed along a parking lot by the new Mead Park parking lot.**
- **27 annual flower beds and 10 downtown flower pots planted and maintained by staff.**

Annual tree survey:

- Issues addressed are things such as Dutch elm disease, oak wilt (public/private), blocked street signage, high risk street trees, etc. Performed after July 4th weekend.
- **214 locations/ addresses inspected due to survey in 2016.**
- **46 Dutch elm disease notices sent in 2016.**
- 32 public nuisance notices sent in 2016, included oak wilt notices.
- 11 public/private schools targeted for tree obstruction issues in two block radius.

Tree Pruning, Removal and Stump Removal:

- **Tree removal done by contractor and /or forestry staff 256 trees removed.**
- Contractor aiding in tree pruning of larger trees. Contractor pruned about 100 street trees.
- **Forestry staff pruned about 1400 trees.**
- **10 elm trees will be injected to prevent Dutch elm disease.**

Watering & Mulching Street Trees/Flower Beds/Downtown Square:

- **6 perennial beds maintained by Master Gardeners.**
- **11 Downtown parking lots mulched.**
- **1000 young or median trees mulched annually.**
- Manicure Pfiffner Park grounds for Riverfront Rendezvous.
- Contract maintenance of Shopko, Parking Lot 16 and Square parking lots.

Emerald Ash Borer & Public Relations

- Five press releases to be submitted.
- Partnered with the Golden Sand Resource, Conservation and Development Council to spread EAB Awareness.
- **Emerald ash borer traps installed and Green Ribbon Ash Awareness Campaign.**
- Emerald ash borer was found in Stevens Point in April 2016.
- Held Emerald Ash Borer Homeowner workshop was held in June.
- **550 ash trees will be treated by a contractor annually.**
- Updated Forestry webpage updated with help of CA-3.

Construction

- **Sixth Avenue construction monitored.**
- Sidewalk replacement throughout city coordinated with forestry/public works/street departments. We provided root pruning and guidance on tree preservation.

Turf Maintenance

- Goerke synthetic turf broomed once a week, deep raked once, swept once, roller magnetized three times.
- 13 different athletic/turf areas managed (fertilizer, aerating herbicide application, seeding, topdressing, thatch)

Playground Inspection and repair

- **26 play sets/swing sets are inspected monthly**
- Pfiffner and Bukolt playground sets were scheduled for replacement. Replacements were pushed back by Council.
- **CVMIC has been touring and inspecting playgrounds with staff.**

Track and Field/Tennis

- **Eight track meets held in 2016.**
- **Fourteen tennis matches in 2016.**

General

- The forestry dept. continues to look for groups to partner with to aid in accomplishing goals. Volunteers from Master Gardeners, Wisconsin Public Service, Audubon, UWSP, MSTC, and Skyward help. A number of community service workers are utilized.
- Much of our work is accomplished with 2 full-time employees, and 5 full-time seasonal staff.
- Staff from parks and streets departments' aid in tree planting and removals when available.
- Sidewalk and parking lot snow removal responsibilities upheld.

- **City begins treating 550 street ash trees.**
- **City continues to remove and replant 572 street and park ash trees.**
- Landscape downtown Shopko lot - contractor
- Spring & Fall street tree planting (256 trees) – staff/contractor

- Sixth Ave. reconstruction tree preservation
- Memorial tree signage and brochure redone along Riverfront.
